

What services are available through the MFP Program?

The MFP program assists Hoosiers transitioning from a nursing facility or hospital by providing:

- Information to help individuals make informed choices regarding transition and participation in the MFP program and waivers
- Assessment by a nurse indicating that the individual can safely move and live independently and is determined to meet nursing facility level of care
- Access to transition services and assistance
- Follow-up by a transition nurse and transition specialist to ensure the move has been satisfactory and the individual's community-based needs are being met
- A Personal Emergency Response System (PERS), a 24-hour emergency response service for increased health and safety
- Enhanced transportation to places such as the grocery store, beauty or barber shop and leisure activities
- Help in locating a place to live and arranging for medical, rehabilitative, home health, and other services in the community, as needed



How do I Participate?

If an individual is eligible to participate in the MFP program based on the criteria in this brochure, willingness to assist in the development of the plan of care is all that is needed to become a participant.



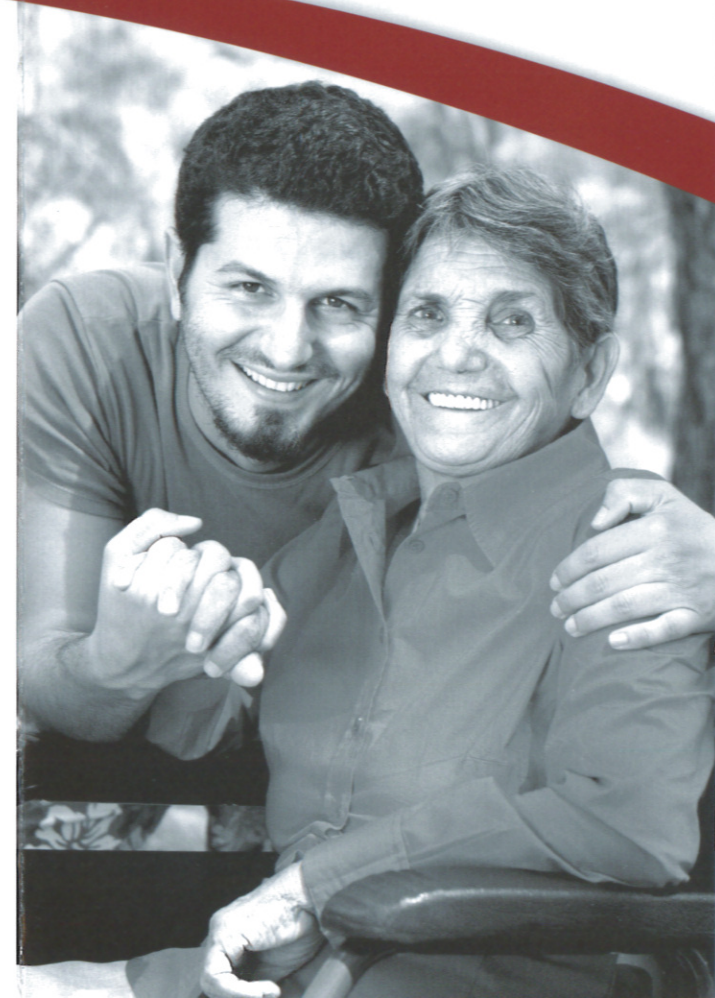

Who is ADVANTAGE Health Solutions?

ADVANTAGE Health Solutions, Inc.SM (ADVANTAGE) is a local health plan contracted with the State of Indiana, Family and Social Services Administration's Division of Aging to oversee and implement the Money Follows the Person (MFP) Demonstration Grant.

ADVANTAGE places a strong emphasis on working to improve the overall health of Hoosiers and Indiana communities. ADVANTAGE has tremendous medical management and wellness programs in place to help Hoosiers be the healthiest they can be.



Who is the MFP Program?

MFP is a special program developed by the federal government to implement a system of appropriate, person-centered, needs based services for individuals seeking to transition from nursing facilities to qualified home and community-based settings.

This project will help Hoosiers who desire to move from a nursing facility or hospital into a qualified setting in the community such as:

- A home owned or leased by the individual or the individual's family
- An apartment with a personal lease, with lockable access and egress which includes living, sleeping, bathing, and cooking areas in which the individual or individual's family has domain and control.
- A residence in which no more than four unrelated individuals reside (such as adult foster care)
- Assisted Living Facility
- Adult Foster Care

Who is Eligible to Participate in the MFP Program?

To be eligible to participate in MFP, an individual must:

- Meet nursing facility long term level of care
- Have lived in a nursing facility or hospital for at least three (3) months
- Be Medicaid eligible for at least one (1) day prior to discharge
- Have health needs that can be met through services available in the community
- Voluntarily consent to participation by signing a consent form
- Be eligible for either the Aged and Disabled (A/D) or Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) or Developmentally Disabled (DD) waiver

MFP participants will be covered by the program for 365 days, after which time, the A/D, TBI, or DD waiver will assess client for continued services upon meeting appropriate level of care.
